Arrival at school in the morning

Congratulations to Evan Keoghan who was voted the Student Council Representative for 1st class. We are very proud of him.



We have been busy preparing for our first "Do this in memory of me" mass on the 22nd of October. We are practising our prayers and songs everyday.







Butterfly Room






Keep reading!
